“Divine Delivery” by Pastor Yemisi Bamgbose

Isaiah 55:11 So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.

From this scripture, it is certain that the word of God for you shall not go without fulfilment. In your season of divine delivery, time, location and preparation are all crucial points to note. Divine means beyond human; something emanating from God. God is the architect of all miracles and blessings.

Delivery is an act of distribution of goods to the recipient. Every promise of God has a point of delivery, and this is your month that God has set apart to deliver your own special miracle to you. You must know and recognise your season of divine delivery as a pregnant woman will know her season to deliver her baby. You must also position yourself to receive your desired blessings as location is a very crucial and important part of your delivery.

God can use any means possible to deliver yours to you. During pregnancy, a woman prepares herself for the day of delivery. She is expected to look after herself, eat and sleep well, and visit the antenatal clinic in order to ensure the wellbeing of her unborn child. She gets herself ready for the day of delivery, as she knows that her baby must arrive after nine months of an incubating period.

On the day of delivery she must cooperate fully with the midwives for the safety of her child. At the point of delivery the pregnant woman travails before she delivers her baby. She does not stop pushing until the baby's head appears and the entire body emerges. It is at that point that she has given birth to a baby. Likewise, we must continue to wait on God, stand upon His Word by faith, travail in prayer, fast, and feast on the word of God until our miracle reaches our hand.

A woman at delivery knows when to push and when to refrain from pushing. If she disobeys the instruction of the midwife, she may jeopardise her safety and that of her child.

Likewise we must obey the Holy Spirit in our season of divine delivery in order not to miss our miracle.

A postman is employed to deliver the mail without delay. A parcel can only be delivered to the individual it is addressed to and not to any other person. Are you in the right place?

Time also plays a major role for each miracle to reach its targeted destination. For instance, first-class mail can take a minimum of 24 hours delivery time, whilst second-class mail can take 48 hours before delivery. Some parcels do not reach their supposed destination, whilst others are intercepted along the way; may your delivery reach your hands in Jesus name. It is expected that when we pray, the answers would be delivered to us in earnest, but sometimes some prayers go unanswered. There are various delivery modes that God can use to deliver miracles and blessings to His children.

In *Exodus 3:7-12*, God sent Moses to deliver the children of Israel out of slavery. They can either accept or reject God's offer of deliverance. Failure to accept God's offer will keep them in bondage forever and the fault can no longer be that of God. It is worth noting that the delivery is incomplete without an acceptance. If you do not accept the parcel sent to you, it will be returned back to the sender. It cannot be forced on you. If God has promised to bless you, no power from hell can hinder the promises except you. Naaman nearly lost his miracle to pride and ignorance; he was comparing the water in Syria to River Jordan where his miracle awaited him. Joseph did not assume the position of premiership until he had

gone through the experiences he went through. During that season, he waited patiently on God until he was promoted.

Many of us are expecting heaven to obey us by releasing our blessings, but on the other hand, some are clearly disobeying God's commandment on tithes and offerings, and as a result have closed their heaven, or have made it a brass heaven. Your season of delivery will not come unless you repent and retribute your ways. When we disobey God, the adverse effect is that everything God has created will disobey us. Law of harvest says, whatever you sow, you will reap; sow obedience and you will reap obedience.

Finally, the word of God is forever settled. Expect your miracle and position yourself right and all that heaven has in store for you will definitely reach your hands without fail in Jesus name.

That all so familiar tune of my alarm on my phone woke me up; it was 4am, the earliest I have ever been awake and the previous night was prom, so yeah I was TIRED! My vision was blurry and glazed, but yet- I knew I had to force myself to wake up; in seven hours time I would be in Wales! I packed up the last of my things- in a very large suitcase and slowly but surely began to get ready. Two hours later, I was wide awake and found myself on a coach buckled in and began dreaming on what I should expect on the journey and also what I was hoping to gain. I thought positively as personally I have no regrets, within minutes I drifted into sleep. Soon after, I could hear soft murmurs, also, excited buzzes around me as I woke up again. There were so many unfamiliar faces around me on the coach and a couple of faces, which I recognised. And of course I set off on this journey with some of my friends from school. Everyone who was on the coach with me seemed to have motive for the week: some to make friends, increase their chances of employment or just generally have a good summer away from parents. To be honest I was there for all of them, especially as I like meeting new people. I plugged my earphones in and begun to listening to my music blocking everything else around me out, not long now until we reached our destination.

Five blessed hours later, I had arrived safely in Wales and I was slightly overcome by nerves. Everyone made a rush to get out of the coach and to take his or her suitcases.

I was prepared for a fully hectic week ahead of me. Soon after we were given our rooms and within minutes I had already begun talking to my roommates. We were given short time to rest and started games, which would improve our social skills and help us to know each other better. Over the next couple of days we were taken from the residential centre to various places over south Wales to

- **Canoeing**- this was the simplest activity out of all of them, although at several times I thought our boat would capsize! The four hour journey down the river was long but in the end we made it- rowing our boat
- **Mountain climbing**- this was one of the greatest achievements, climbing a mountain. The journey up was long and I think I must have prayed at least twice on the way up because if u lost your footing when climbing up you could only go one way- down. When I reached the top of the mountain I was speechless, the view was extraordinary and I was thrilled. Benefits of The Eleven Plus *by Esther Ajewole*

The eleven plus is a special designed test for year six pupils in England. This test is specially designed to test the academic ability of a child. In addition to this, if a year six student is successful in passing the eleven plus they will have the opportunity in securing a place in a grammar school which are known to offer the best possible education for 11-18 year olds. Current league tables also show that grammar schools achieve better in GCSE's and A- Level results compared to non-selective schools.

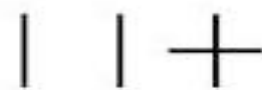

It is thought that it is best for the child to begin preparation for the eleven plus early so they can become familiar with question types and also timing. With time, the eleven plus will become a routine practise for them and they will feel less anxious when it comes down the real examination.

Thousands of people both locally and in neighbouring towns compete for a limited number of spaces in schools. Therefore, this conveys the eleven plus exam has so many benefits for a child both in the short and long run. Every parent wants their child to succeed and the first step is for them to consider taking the eleven-plus. The examination can be seen as one of the many milestones that a child will experience in their life and it is also very rewarding, with grammar schools offering so many opportunities for their students and pushing them to achieve to the best of their capability. Not only do employers highlight on the secondary school a child moved on from but also the grades they achieved.

Different schools and boroughs offer diverse examinations on: mathematics, English, verbal reasoning and non- verbal reasoning. With mathematics and English, primary school students would be familiar with however, with both reasoning papers after completing past papers- students will become more familiar with the question types.
